DIRECTORS NOTES

My favorite band is Roger Clyne and the Peacemakers. They used to be The Refreshments and had one hit, Banditos, in 1996. They made a second album, got dropped from their label, broke up, then reformed as a different band with their own label. Now they market themselves and have a pretty solid following of people who, like me, are just a little *too* obsessed with their music.

A recurring theme in their music is love. Romantic love, love between parents and children, love for friends and family, love for strangers. There's a philosophy of being open to love in all forms that comes through in almost every song. One of my favorites is Mercy, which features a chorus of "You already shine, you already shine, you already shine..." The message I took from it is that you should love yourself as much as you love everyone around you.

How does this tie into *Play It Again, Sam?* Love. My 14-year marriage ended in 2014, and I listened to so much Roger Clyne it wasn't even funny. I needed to know that love was real. In *Play It Again, Sam*, the main characters are all dealing with the universal and very human need for love. Allan's marriage just ended, Linda feels unloved, and Dick is unaware of just how important love is in his life. When I was chosen to direct this play, my marriage had only been officially over for a few months. These themes were extremely relatable.

We see the action unfold through Allan's eyes and his imagination. In his insecurity, he creates small movies out of every moment. There's even a montage, a movie standard, at the top of act II showing how he fails at every attempt to find love. We see him begin to pick up on how unhappy his friends' marriage really is. Ultimately, we see him discover new forms of love that don't involve romance, including the ability to love himself as he is. He already shines.

It has been a privilege to work with such a talented group. Every actor and crew member has brought something new and interesting to this play. I am so proud of all their hard work and generosity in making this production something special.

In the words of Roger Clyne, life is grand, love is real, and beauty is everywhere. Enjoy the show!


Dylan Bass (Allan Felix)
